OUT OF BOUNDS

Defined by any fence bounding the course is by the inside points at ground level and the River Tweed except the area defined as a lateral water hazard.

WATER HAZARDS

Identified by Yellow Stakes (Rule 26).

LATERAL WATER HAZARD

Identified by Red Stakes (Rule 26).

STAKED TREES

If such a tree interferes with a player's stance or the area of intended swing, the ball MUST be lifted without penalty and dropped in accordance with Rule 24-2(1).

ROADS AND PATHWAYS

Interference by an abnormal ground condition occurs when a ball lies in or touches the condition or when the condition interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing. No penalty. This ruling is applicable to the road between the 2nd and 9th Greens. All constructed paths and steps are immovable obstructions (Rule 24-2).

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS

The markers, wooden seats, yardage posts and protective fence at 4th tee are treated as immovable obstructions (Rule 24-2).

PROTECTIVE FENCE AT THE 4TH HOLE

Interference of the protective fence by line of sight if obscured, or relief from the obstruction. Nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole. No penalty.

EMBEDED BALL

A ball embedded in its own pitch-mark in the ground in any closely mown area through the green may be lifted, cleaned and dropped, without penalty, as near as possible to the spot where it lay. "Closely mown area" means any area of the course, including paths through the rough, cut to fairway height or less.
