

Top 6 Maintenance Pet Peeves

1. Unrepaired ball marks are a big problem. On any given morning, it is not uncommon to see a dozen or so unrepaired ball marks on every green.
2. Foot dragging on the greens has become a big problem over the last couple of years. Golf partners are going to have to let someone know when they are dragging their feet. Tennis shoes are recommended for those who have trouble picking up their feet.
3. Damaged holes on the greens from raking the ball out with a putter head or mis handling the flag pole.
4. Entering a bunker on the high side, or on a steep slope, occurs quite often. Damage to the bunker lip and huge, caved in, footprints in the sand are the result. Please enter the bunker from the low side.
5. Ropes and stakes are used to direct foot traffic in certain high wear areas. Please do not step on the rope to cross over it, simply walk around the roped area.
6. On extremely wet days the course receives a lot of damage from carts passing in the grass. Please park to the side of the trail in order to allow carts to pass without getting off the trail.
