WEEKLY PROCEDURES

- On each day you play, place **\$1** in the middle slot located at the desk. Check that you have played and paid for that day. This money will be used for winners of that day's event.
- Winners will earn money to be awarded at the end of the season banquet and awards night. The number of players each week will determine the number of winners and the amount each will receive. Events will be flighted by handicap so that all level of players can win.
- Winners will be posted in Saturday morning's *Topeka Capital Journal*, as well as sent to members through e-mail each week.
- The first Tuesday of each month is the KGA event.
- There will be a flag hole on the first Tuesday of each month to determine who wins the Ladies monthly parking spot. Everyone will be notified prior to play as to what the hole is.
- Mark down the number of putts on every hole.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- This is a 9-hole league.
- League dues are \$25, payable to LSLEL and given to the Treasurer. This money will be used to pay for League tournament winners' prizes, pars, birdies, and chip-ins, and for the end-of-season dinner meeting. \$25 is due and payable to Lake Shawnee Golf Club (LSGC) for your 18-hole (GHIN) handicap and membership to KGA.
- T-times are reserved for our League between 4:32 and 5:21 PM on Tuesday evenings. The Lake Shawnee Golf Course management requires T-times. T-times can now be made on-line four days in advance or on Tuesday after league play.
- The evening's event will be posted by the sign-in sheet at the desk.
- A minimum of six (6) players is needed to play each evening to qualify as an event and pay winners.

LOCAL RULES

- Play the ball **UP**. This tends to speed up play.
- Play from the **RED** tees. At age 60 and over, the player has the option to either hit from the red or gold tees. However, if you choose to play from the gold tees then you must play from there consistently throughout the entire golf league season.
- **Play READY golf!** The goal of the league is to provide a time when players can enjoy both a round of golf and the camaraderie of other league players. We want to play at a pace that allows you to play the best round of golf possible, while being aware of the play of others. See HELPFUL HINTS FOR ELIMINATION SLOW PLAY on last page.
- On **Holes #4 & 17**, if you hit the ball into the water, you may go to the alternate tee box and hit from there, but you will not be able to use a tee. If you prefer to hit from your normal tee box again, you may do so and you may use a tee. Either way you will be hitting your third shot.
- Play all water shots (other than #4 and #17) as a lateral hazard. Play from the point the ball entered the water. EX: If you are on the tee box on #2 or #5, you would go to the area where the ball entered the water and hit from that point. You would then be hitting your third shot. As in regular *USGA Rules of Golf*, out-of-bounds shots constitute a stroke and distance penalty.
- Once you have hit 10 shots on any hole, you may pick up your ball and record a 10 on the scorecard.

SCORECARDS AND RECORDING SCORES

- Make sure that both first and last names of each player are on the scorecard.
- At completion of play, add up the scores and the scorer should sign the scorecard. You should post your ADJUSTED score in the computer using Equitable Stroke Control (ESC). ESC is the downloaded adjustment of individual hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability. ESC sets a maximum number a player can post on any hole depending on the player's Course Handicap. However, do not change your original score on the scorecard.
- Place scorecards in the middle slot located at the desk (same place you checked your name and put your \$1).
- If you are playing an event such as "Revert worst hole to par" where it changes your actual score: enter your ESC score into the computer and record the revised score on the scorecard. The revised score is only for determining event winners for our League.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR ELIMINATING SLOW PLAY (READY GOLF)

On The Tee

1. Hit when ready and safe. Do not use the honor system.
2. Shorter length hitters should hit first.
3. Tee-off as soon as the group ahead is clear.
4. Carry an extra ball in your pocket.

On The Fairway

1. Hit when ready and safe. Do not use the honors system.
2. Take appropriate clubs to your ball. Hit without delay.
3. Each groups' player should watch the other player's shot.
4. Limit your search for lost balls.
5. When driving a cart, drop your cart partner at her ball with appropriate clubs, and then continue to yours.

On The Green

1. Place your clubs between the green and the next tee.
2. Study your putt while others are putting.
3. Continue putting until holed out.
4. Leave the green immediately after holing out and proceed to the next tee.
5. Complete your scorecard at the next tee.
