## Golf Etiquette & Courtesy on the Course

### 1. Consideration for Other Players

- The player who has the honour should be allowed to play before their opponent or fellow-competitor tees his ball.
- No one should move, talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
- In the interest of all, players should play without delay.
- No player should play until the players in front are out of range. Players searching for a ball should signal the players behind them to pass as soon as becomes apparent that the ball will not easily be found. Players only have three minutes to search for a ball.
- When the play of a hole has been completed, players should immediately leave the putting green.

### 2. Priority on the Course

- A single player has no standing and should give way to a match of any kind.
- Any match playing a whole round is entitled to pass a match playing a shorter round.
- If a match fails to keep its place on the course and loses more than one clear hole on the players in front, it should allow the match following to pass.

### COMPETITION TYPES (see Rule 3)

**Match Play** – consists of one side against another over a *stipulated round* unless otherwise decreed by the **Committee**. The game is played in holes.

**Stroke or Medal Play** - consists of individual *competitors* playing a *stipulated round* or rounds under rules determined by the **Committee**. In a Scratch competition the winner is the player returning the lowest number of strokes. In a Handicap competition the winner is the player returning the lowest number of strokes less his/her playing handicap.

**SLOW PLAY** can be frustrating for others on the course as well as being avoidable. Maintain a comfortable pace and everybody will benefit.
