One Of The Favorites

The Tombstone Tournament has long been a Men's Club favorite. This is an individual tournament played from the white tees. You are not only competing against the field, but against yourself. Each player is given a "tombstone" with his name and the allowed number of strokes for his round. The number is calculated by adding your handicap to the course rating from the white tees. If your handicap is 20, your tombstone will have an 85 written on it. After you have hit your 85th stroke, you have "died" and must place your tombstone in the ground where you ball stops. You are allowed to finish the round and post your score, but the tombstone determines your position in the tournament. If you finish the 18th hole with less than your stroke allotment, you move to the first tee and continue until you have reached your "death" and put your tombstone in that spot. On occasion some of the luckier golfers are able to get beyond 18 to the second hole. The majority of golfers "die" on 16, 17 or 18, with a few of the unlucky ones "dead" on 15.

This tournament is played from the whites and, as always, is divided into flights.

Field Day and Annual Meeting

Field Day is Wednesday the 10th. It is a scramble, with teams made up so that there will be at least one "A" player on each team, It is a shotgun start, played from the white tees.

After the tournament, we will have the Field Day Dinner and the Men's Club Annual Meeting. The primary agenda at the meeting is the election of Board Members. There are currently two members up for reelection and two empty slots to be filled. If your are interested in running for the Board, please let one of the current Board Members know.
