



# PGC Women's 9 Hole League Tournament Descriptions

## ANY FIVE CLUBS

This tournament is played with 5 clubs of your choice. The rest of the clubs stay in the car. Example: 5 wood, 9 wood, 7 iron, 9 iron, and putter could be your choice of clubs. No one can use another person's clubs- only the five in your golf bag. If you carry any more than 5 clubs in your bag, you will be disqualified. SORRY. This is a low gross and low net tournament.

## CLOSEST TO THE LINE

The object is to be the golfer who hits the ball closest to the line. A white line is chalked down the middle of the fairway (or a colored string). The ball that comes closest to the line wins the prize.

## CLOSEST TO THE PIN

The tee shot on a par 3 hole that comes to rest nearest the pin gets the prize.

## EVEN HOLES ½ HANDICAP

Your score will be the gross total of the even numbered holes minus ½ of your handicap (total handicap, divide by 2 and round up) This will be your net score. Keep score as usual and enter nine hole score on your card.

## FIVE BLIND HOLES

The Pro will pick 5 holes. We will not know which holes they are until we return to the clubhouse. Blind holes will be listed on the tournament sheet in the clubhouse. This is a low gross tournament played in each flight.

## FOUR PLAYER BEST BALL

Four Player Best Ball is a tournament golf format in which teammates all play their own ball, choosing the best *gross* score on each hole for the team's score. If the team consists of three players, the team chooses a blind player from another group to complete the foursome.

## LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

This is a Low Gross Tournament played with 18 holes of golf in two weeks. The first week members play the front 9 and the second week the back 9. There is NO Flight Separation. Everyone will compete against each other. Low gross and low net prize money will be awarded for each of the two weeks, in addition to the League Championship Tournament prize.

## LOW GROSS OR LG

Low gross equals your total score from a round of golf.

## LOW GROSS MINUS PUTTS

This tournament is played in the first five games to allow a new player a chance to compete while playing enough games (5) to get a handicap. All players keep track of putts and at the end of a round subtracts the total putts from their score. This is a gross tournament.

## LOW NET or LN

Your total gross score minus your handicap will determine your low net score.

**LOW GROSS ODD HOLES minus 1/2 HANDICAP**

Score will be based on the gross score of odd holes minus 1/2 your handicap (total handicap, divide by 2 and round up to next number.)

**LOW PUTTS OR LP ONLY**

Count putts per hole separate from your score.

If your total score for the hole is 6 and 3 of those strokes were putts, record your score as 6/3. If you max out (11) before reaching green, record your score as 10/X, or 7/X. If you take an X on any hole you will record it as a hole with the most putts. So, let's say you have 3 putts on a hole and it is the most putts on your score card. So, you would take a 3 for all the X's on your card. A PUTT IS ANY STROKE TAKEN ON THE GREEN.

**PRESIDENT'S CUP**

This a Low Net Tournament played with 18 holes of golf in two weeks. The first week players play the front nine and the second week the back nine. There is NO Flight Separation. Everyone competes against each other. Also, we will be giving low net and low gross prize money each of the two weeks for regular tournament play.

**SCRAMBLE**

This scramble is played with four players. Each player will tee off and the best stroked ball will be chosen. Every player will hit from the BEST BALL position. Play will continue this way until hole is finished. If three players, rotate the extra shot. If two players, play two balls. Two tee shots must be used from each player. The remaining tee shot may be used from any player. This is a Team Gross Scramble Tournament.

**STABLEFORD**

Stableford is a game based on a point system, where the points you earn are determined by your score on the hole. Prizes can be awarded by flights for Gross and /or Net for the player with the highest point total.

Hole in One= 6

Double Eagle=5

Eagle=4

Birdie=3

Par=2

Bogey=1

Double Bogey or worse=0
